\*\* Completion of a paper on a business law topic for an independent legal research course (L860), either in conjunction with or independent of Law Review or the Journal of Law & Health, can satisfy the Project Requirement. Such a paper must be done under the supervision (or co-supervision) of a member of the core business law faculty. A student should obtain approval of the paper topic and arrange for a core supervisor (or co-supervisor) in the semester preceding the semester in which the student will write the paper.

\*\*\* Any of the seminars listed above may satisfy the project requirement if a substantial paper is required or undertaken as an option. Check with the instructor to determine whether a paper will be required or be an option. A seminar that fulfills the project requirement cannot also be counted toward the elective course credit requirements.

\*\*\*\* Placements could include externship with the Cleveland Clinic or University Hospitals, IMG, the U.S. Bankruptcy Court, the Federal Reserve Bank of Cleveland, the Federal Trade Commission, the White Collar Crime Section of the U.S. Attorney's Office, or any other governmental agency (provided that the government externship primarily involved the regulation of business). Individual students would have to receive written certification from the faculty advisor for the Business Law Concentration that their externships primarily involved business law.

\*\*\*\*\* A student may take no more than one course on a pass/fail basis toward completion of a Concentration, whether a substantive course for which a grade is normally given or an externship or other course that is mandatorily graded on a pass/fail basis. . **If a student takes a course that is normally a graded course on a pass/fail basis, the "true" grade earned by the student for the course will be included in calculating the student's cumulative GPA in the Concentration, for the purposes of determining if the student has met the required minimum 3.0 cumulative GPA for a Concentration.**
