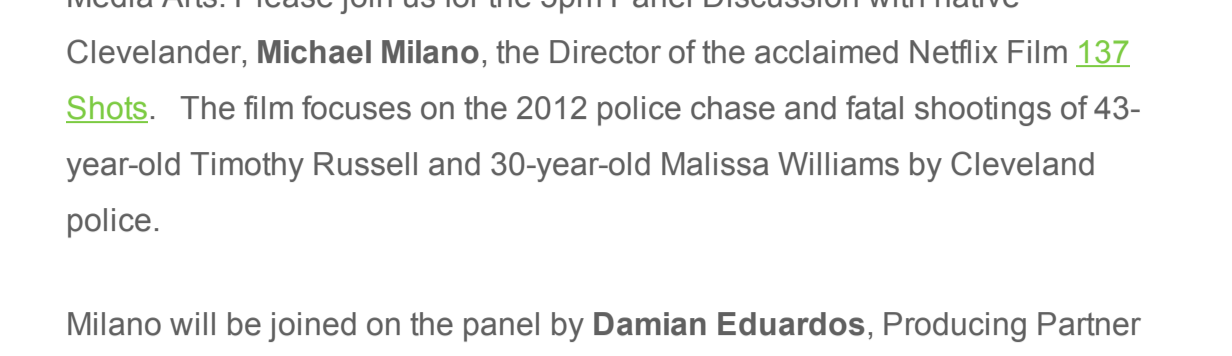

The victories mark the fifth consecutive year that our **BLSA Thurgood Marshall Team** has won the Midwest Regional Competition. Additionally, this is the first time that our BLSA Chapter will be sending two C|M|LAW Thurgood Marshall Teams to nationals.

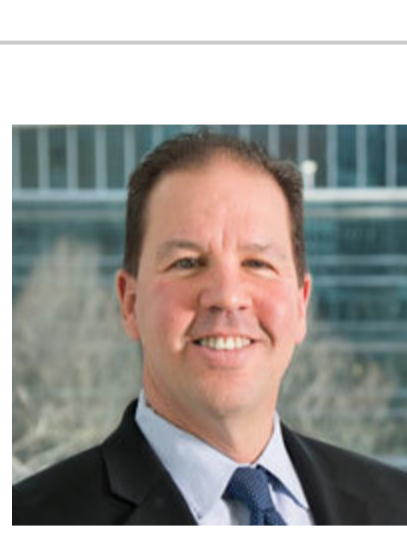


CSU C|M|LAW Announced 3+3 Program With Kent State University

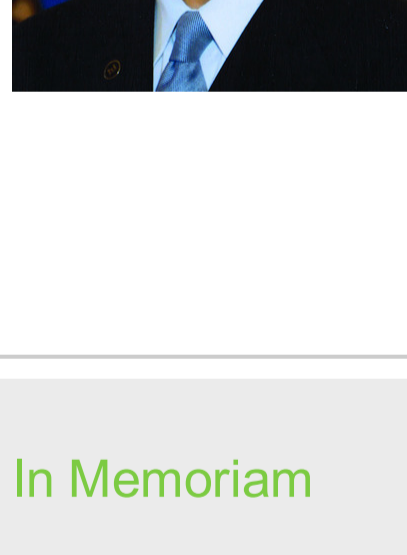
Criminal Justice Forum **Crimmigrators**

Juliet Stumpf, the Robert E. Jones Professor of Advocacy and Ethics at Lewis & Clark Law School

Since the events of September 11, 2001, crimmigration scholars around the world have uncovered the use of seemingly ordinary powers to accomplish extraordinary things: mass deportation, surveillance, policing, and detention and incarceration, in ways that globally change the shape of migration. While the study of crimmigration usually dissects its elements and the powers that animate it, we miss a critical question if we ignore who is tasked to use those powers. The decision about who will decide a crimmigration issue can shape the decision itself, and confine or define its resolution.

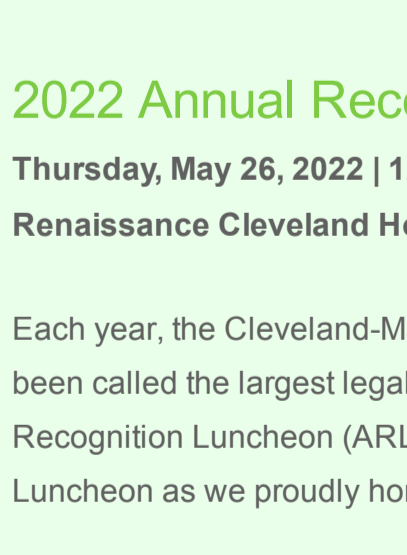

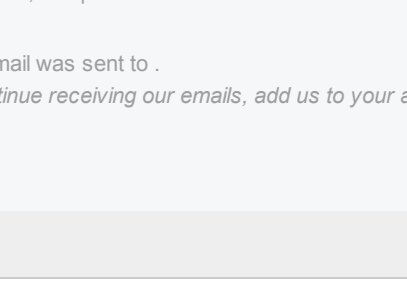
