- 1. Funding Request

 - i. Norman S. Minor Holiday CLE
 - 1. Mental Health and Professional Ethics
 - 2. The speakers normal fee is \$10K; NSMBA has a discount but they asked for our help
 - **3.** Speaker also agreed to come to the school to do a brown bag about voter protection
 - 4. They want \$1,500 from BLSA

d. Academic Review Committee:

i. Contacted Borden

1. Moved Corporations, Tax, etc. not to overlap.

ii. Comment: Lauren

1. 2L's are frustrated about the way times open for enrollment

- 2. **Reasoning** (Nina): if you are closest to graduation, you enroll into classes first, so you can graduate on time
- iii. **Comment (Tiffany):** Let Tiffany know about these issues because she meets with Dean Fisher and Borden on a regular basis.

e. Curriculum Committee:

- i. Voted on "Semesterization" of Con Law—Likely to be passed.
- ii. Voted on Upper Level Requirements
 - 1. Getting rid of all requirements except ABA required:
 - a. One writing course past legal writing with faculty supervision
 - 2. Suggested that legal writing, upper level writing, etc be in one class
- iii. Recommendations:
 - Voted to Eliminate: Perspectives, Evidence, Con Law—as required courses
 - a. Comment (Tiffany): People who have passed the bar have mentioned how much more rough it would be if they didn't take Evidence.
 - b. Response: We talked about Bar Passage v. Students who don't want to practice law; question presented--What makes it so that Evidence and Con Law are more important than other Con Law courses?
 - c. Response (Tiffany): She was under the impression that i.e Wills (you can learn on your own), but that Con Law and Evidence couldn't be learned easier on one's own/without Barbri.

- d. Response: i.e. Not taking Secured, Corp, Commercial is also hard to learn on your own; politically, the committee's thinking is just to rid all of the required courses outside of ABA. Once the committee got past the bar stuff, it made the decision easier; The committee is not getting rid of the courses; They juset aren't requiring them.
- e. Pretty sure Con Law will pass. Over all curriculum stuff is HOT.
- 2. When the committee meets do they speak with the Planning Committee? Do they look at other schools?
 - a. Yes: What they found is that Con Law is the only one required. Top 50 schools require it, but other schools pretty much don't. Writing standards vary at other schools.
 - b. They haven't looked at what classes students think helped most.
- 3. Comment: (Heather): Talked with Dean Fisher about how to make us more distinctive. Certificate programs have been up in the air.
 - Not requiring something like Evidence for JD advantage students, would help them be able to better obtain certificates.
 - b. Comment (Gary): Something like Con Law might be diluted if students have the option to take or don't take.
- f. Bar Update (Heather): Incentives for People to Complete Barbri
 - i. 75% completion= \$500
 - ii. 90% completion = \$1000
- g. <u>Class for Students at Risk:</u> Prof. Robertson and Nick DeSantis are thinking to teach the class.
