Electronic Discovery Update

November 12, 2011

If you are looking for a way to incorporate electronic evidence in your matter, or if you are interested in keeping current with the analysis of federal and state courts regarding electronic evidence, this course will help you. An overview of the strategies and tactics, and federal and state civil and criminal case law, this course will provide attorneys with the knowledge necessary to integrate electronic evidence into their practices, including litigation, domestic relations, labor/employment, contract disputes, etc. No prior computer experience is necessary to understand the legal and strategic issues surrounding electronic evidence; the course will present attendees with a “way of thinking” about electronic evidence that reflects the transition in the practice of law from paper to electronic devices and electronic information storage systems. Discussion will include real-life ways in which practitioners can begin to immediately use electronic evidence in all types of matters to better serve their clients and grow their practice.

**Chair: Donald A. Wochna, J.D.**, University of Chicago, is one of the founding partners of Vestige Digital Investigations and a pioneer in the development and application of computer forensics to the practice of law. A trial lawyer for 22 years, Mr. Wochna has earned a reputation as an engaging and articulate electronic evidence expert in civil discovery, internal investigations and criminal defense litigation. He is a widely sought CLE speaker on electronic evidence and the impact on the law and the discovery process of the proliferation of devices that can become “electronic witnesses” in all types of cases.

Ethics, Professionalism and Substance Abuse\*

November 19, 2011

This program will cover three broad topics: (1) An exploration of the ethical rules, both the Ohio Code of Professional Responsibility and the ABA Model Rules, on what constitutes the unauthorized practice of law and the issues to consider when an Ohio attorney acts in a legal capacity in another state; (2) What exactly is professionalism? What are the relevant considerations and limits? Does a prospective client want a lawyer who is professional or can the client even detect the difference; is the client more interested in an effective lawyer as opposed to a professional one?; (3) The who, how and why of the impaired lawyer: the causes, treatment and prevention of impairment are well documented and will be discussed. What about the detection of impairment, though? How can you be sure and how sure do you need to be?
