Effective July 1, 2001, the Gramm-Leach-Bliley Act (GLBA) placed strict limits on purposes for which a financial institution may disclose "non-public personal information." This type of information is contained in the credit header data LexisNexis and its competitors receive from the credit bureaus. The GLBA and subsequent regulations issued by the FTC and other federal agencies directly affect the Person Locator products derived from such credit header data.
