*A student may either take an externship as one of the three elective courses in the concentration or in fulfillment of the Project Requirement. However, students may not take more than one externship to satisfy any of the concentration requirements.

**Participation in Moot Court must be in the area of criminal law or procedure and be certified as such by the faculty advisor to Moot Court, and enrollment is governed by the by-laws of the Moot Court Board of Governors.

***No more than one course may be taken on a pass/fail basis toward completion of a Concentration, whether a substantive course for which a grade is normally given or an externship or other course that is mandatorily graded on a pass/fail basis. If a student takes a course on a pass/fail basis that is normally a graded course, the "true" grade earned by the student for the course will be included in calculating the student's cumulative GPA in the Concentration, for the purposes of determining if the student has met the required minimum 3.0 cumulative GPA for a Concentration
