



### New CSU C|J|LAW Student Organization Supports Non-Traditional Law Students to Prepare to Thrive in Legal Careers

Non-Traditional Students, which includes part-time students working through school, "second-career" students, older students, [parenting students](#) and first-generation law students, face all the same obligations of traditional law students as well as additional sets of burdens and challenges that come with the responsibilities of life outside of law school. Last year, a new student organization, the **Non-Traditional Law Student Association (NTLSA)**, was established at CSU Cleveland-Marshall College of Law to provide support, networking opportunities, and a forum to address the unique concerns of this section of the student population.

Current CSU C|J|LAW 3LE Kathryn ("Katey") Hach founded the NTLSA and is now serving as its president. Katey is a member of the part-time evening program and works around 30 hours per week during the school year. She also had an educational break while working full-time between college and law school, and is the first person in her family to attend law school.

Katey recognized the need for the NTLSA during the early stages of the pandemic in the spring of 2020. While all students faced difficulties during that transitional period, she noticed the struggles of non-traditional students were exacerbated and their educational and networking opportunities were limited. When bringing these issues to the attention of the CSU C|J|LAW administration, the benefits of organizing a network non-traditional students became clear.

### Hall of Fame Induction Celebration


On Friday, November 5, CSU C|J|LAW welcomed 25 new honorees to our Hall of Fame at the 2021 Induction Celebration.




