

Annual National Moot Court Competition
Local Rules
Region VI

Under Rule 7 of the Rules established by the New York City Bar's Young Lawyers Committee ("National Rules") for the Annual National Moot Court Competition, Regional Sponsor Cleveland-Marshall College of Law ("Regional Sponsor") sets forth the following Local Rules, which have the same force and effect as the National Rules in Region VI:

L.R. 3.2.6 Because the briefs will be submitted electronically via PDF, National Rule 3.2.6 does not apply.

L.R. 3.3 The PDF scanning process may not reduce the character size.

L.R. 3.4 Each team will be provided with a team number. ONLY that team number should appear in the lower right corner of the brief's cover, in lieu of the names of the competitors and the law school. Teams should identify each competitor on the team and the law school name in the submission email to which the brief is attached.

L.R. 3.5 The certification should be a separate PDF file attached to the **same** submission email as the brief. Briefs that arrive without certifications may be subject to penalties.

L.R. 4.1 Teams must serve briefs on the Regional Sponsor at the email k.f.curran@cmlaw.csuohio.edu by 11:59 pm EST on October 20, 2022.

L.R. 4.3 Teams must serve a PDF file of their brief to each opposing team by emailing it to the email address by 11:59 pm on October 20, 2022. Email addresses will be provided in a memorandum and will be available on Cleveland-Marshall's National Moot Court competition website.

L.R. 4.4 Electronic service is complete upon transmission. The Regional Sponsor will not entertain phone inquiries on October 20, 2022, as to whether a team's brief has been received. The Regional Sponsor will contact any team for which it has not received a brief on October 21, 2022.

L.R. 6.1 The Regional Sponsor will provide Law Clerks for the Competition. Nothing in this Local Rule prevents the Regional Sponsor from using competitors or other eligible participants in the Competition into being Law Clerks should the need arise.

L.R. 6.3 Each Competitor will be timed individually according to the time instructions the team gives to the Law Clerk before the round begins. But if the first Competitor forgets to ask the court for rebuttal, the Law Clerk will add the waived rebuttal time to the time requested for the second Competitor of the same team. The Law

Clerk will show timecards to the court and the Competitor when there are five minutes, three minutes, and one minute remaining in that Competitor's time.
